## 18 STUDENTS HONORED FOR SERVICE TO THE LGBTQ COMMUNITY

San Francisco, May 15, 2015 – eQuality Scholarship Collaborative has announced the recipients of its 2015 scholarships, presented at the 26th Awards Dinner held this evening at the Hotel Nikko in San Francisco.

The event set records for eQuality, with well over \$100,000 awarded to 18

students.

Young leaders from throughout California were honored and recognized for their

service to the LGBTQ community. Twelve graduating high school seniors received

\$6,000 scholarships toward their post-secondary education. A new \$12,000, four-year

scholarship also was awarded to an additional graduating high school senior. Two

nursing scholarships and three medical scholarships also were awarded.

Four additional students from Belmont, Castro Valley, San Francisco, and South Lake Tahoe also received awards.

The scholarships will be applied at institutions from Skyline College to Brown University and in studies ranging from cosmetology to symbolic systems.

Many of the awardees are founders or office-holders in their high school's Gay-Straight Alliance or similar clubs, working to provide safe spaces for all youth. Their activism is evidenced by a broad array of projects ranging from educational equity to marriage equality to emergency mental health intervention. In many cases, their service has extended to other social service and civic initiatives. Over the past 26 years, eQuality has provided almost one million dollars in financial assistance to more than 270 graduating high school seniors, as well as nursing and medical students. It is California's premier LGBTQ and ally youth servicerecognition program. When founded in 1989, it was the first such organization of its kind in the nation.

eQuality is supported by LGBT employee resource groups from Genentech, Kaiser Permanente, KPMG, and PG&E, as well as nonprofit members, the Horizons Foundation and Out & Equal Workplace Advocates, and numerous individual donors and volunteers. eQuality Scholarship Collaborative is a fiscally sponsored project of the Horizons Foundation.
