23 STUDENTS HONORED FOR SERVICE TO THE LGBTQ COMMUNITY

San Francisco, May 20, 2016 – The eQuality Scholarship Collaborative has announced the recipients of its 2016 scholarships, presented at the 27th Awards Dinner held this evening at the Hotel Nikko in San Francisco.

The event set records for eQuality, with \$138,000 awarded to 23 students. This is also a milestone year for eQuality, having now distributed well over \$1 million since the first scholarship was awarded in 1989.

Student leaders from throughout California were honored and recognized for their service to the LGBTQ community. Eighteen graduating high school seniors received \$6,000 scholarships toward their post-secondary education. Two nursing scholarships and three medical scholarships also were awarded.

The scholarships will be applied at institutions from CSU Sacramento to New York University and in studies ranging from neurobiology to vocal performance.

Many of the awardees are founders or leaders in their high school's LGBTQ clubs, providing safe spaces for all youth. Their activism is evidenced by a broad array of projects ranging from educational equity to gender neutrality to mental health services. In many cases,

their service has extended to other social service and civic initiatives.

Over the past 27 years, eQuality has provided financial assistance to more than 300 graduating high school seniors, as well as community college, nursing, and medical students. It is California's premier LGBTQ and ally youth service-recognition program. When founded in 1989, it was the first such organization of its kind in the nation.

eQuality is supported by LGBTQ employee resource groups from Genentech, Kaiser Permanente, KPMG, and PG&E, as well as nonprofit members, GSA Network, the Horizons Foundation, and Out & Equal Workplace Advocates, and numerous individual donors and volunteers.
